

Wood Dust Safe Handling and Prevention

Hazards for humans and the environment

- 1. Wood dust can cause fires and explosions.
- 2. Wood dust can have a sensitising effect and trigger allergies.
- 3. Some types of wood produce fine dust that has been classified as carcinogenic.



Protective measures and emergency procedures

1. Never use a hand grinder or jigsaw without dust extraction.

- 2. Only sand to the required extent, ensuring precise cutting and shaping before sanding.
- 3. Do not knock or shake out sandpaper.
- 4. Don't blow dust away.
- 5. Use a suitable vacuum cleaner.
 Never sweep wood with a broom.

Emergency procedure

- 1. In case of fire, evacuate the room together with the instructor.
- 2. Leave the room if there is a high level of dust after an incident.
